Annual Review of Phytopathology (Vol. 16). Editor: R. G. Grogan; Associate Editors: G. A. Zentmyer and E. B. Cowling. (Annual Reviews, Inc., 4139, El Camino Way, Palo Alto, California 94306, U.S.A.), 1978. Pp. 1-528, Price: \$ 17.00 USA; \$ 17.50 (elsewhere).

As in the case of the fifteen volumes of the reviews published so far, the present sixteenth volume represents another landmark depicting 'he annual researches in the discipline of phytopathology. The centents are organized in a very methodical manner and the prefatory chapter by A. A. Bitancourt, with a sharp autographed photograph of his, on Phytopathology in a developing country represents a very critical and graphic account of its development in Brazil. It represents a very interesting account and the following quotation (p. 18) pointed out by Bitancourt taken from the late plant pathologist Cerold Stahel is particularly very apt, thought-provoking and rather prophetic "Remember the quality of the production of a scientific institution is inversely proportional to its size". This is followed by a number of articles under the following chapters: Historical perspectives:

Appraisal of Plant Disease; Pathogens; Morphology and Anatomy; Physiology of Host-Pathogen Interaction; Genetics of Host-Pathogen Interaction; Epidemiology; Influence of Environment; Chemical Control; Biological and Cultural Control; Breeding for Resistance; Special Topics; finally ending in the Indexes. In a review of this nature it appears to be quite justified that as many as four topics are dealt under Pathogens and three on Epidemiology respectively. In particular the reviews on Root graft transmission of tree pathogens and Reduction of losses in fresh market fruits and vegetables are particularly interesting because of their significant economic value. The special topic on Innovative Teaching of Plant Pathology points out in a very cogent and effective manner, how exactly teaching of this subject should be done under the present conditions. In general, this volume again like all the previous volumes maintains its excellent style and get-up. It deserves a place beyond doubt in the libraries of all institutions where teaching and research in Phytopathology are carried out.
